GO ULTRA HIGH TECH-SPEND TO SAVE

It's a unique idea, but can save thousands off your utility bill. New products for energy efficiency are being introduced every day. While in Kansas City at the Affordable Comfort Institute annual conference, we saw some great new products. One of the worst offenders in a house is the attic access panel. Heating and air conditioning costs stream around the edges of almost every wood or drywall attic cover. McCoy Building Products from Olathe, Kansas has devised an inexpensive insulated attic cover and a pull down stair cover that are Energy Star efficient. Another supplier has a chimney balloon, which inflates and air stops your chimney.

Everyone knows to replace incandescent light bulbs with CFLs. But Leviton takes your room lighting to the next level with its IPP15 light switch which is a "manual-on" switch but turns the lighting circuit off when you leave

the room, for a double savings. Do you turn the shower on in the morning and leave the room to wait for hot water? The Evolve low flow Showerhead automatically reduces the flow to a trickle as soon as the shower water is hot. Turn the knob when you're ready to shower and you're in business.

The number one utility waster in every house is that old refrigerator. If not Energy Star approved, it's a loser. Go buy the new Miele KF 1811. It far exceeds Energy Star minimum rating for energy efficiency. Next time you need to replace your natural gas furnace, look into the Trane XV95, or by then, other manufacturers will catch up. Condensing furnaces were originally rated at 90% efficient, but Trane XV95 converts 96.7% of fuel into heat.
