EPA Contractor Regulations are Problematic

April 2010 marks the date EPA gets into the pockets of every rental property owner. From that date forward, whenever a contractor or property owner performs maintenance on a property built prior to 1978 containing a child under age six or a pregnant woman, various lead safe practices must be accomplished. including a lead inspection by a certified lead inspector, or by a contractor or property owner who has undergone mandatory lead paint training. Untrained contractors or property owners will be prohibited from performing maintenance or renovation work.

Notice the emphasis on property owner. Even property owners must comply with this regulation. In the past, an owner could do his or her own work without restriction.

Commencing in April, about the only selfhelp work left will be pre-occupancy cleaning. Pick up a hammer or screwdriver and the regs kick in. Property owners must get training to perform their own work.

One helpful aspect of these regulations is that any portion of a property certified to be lead-free is exempt from the regs. Many properties have been found only to contain lead paint on exterior surfaces or just the front apartment door and door frame. With our certification in hand. contractors cannot stick it to our clients.
